


# DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID (DNA) IDENTIFICATION ACT 2009

An Act to provide for the establishment of a Forensic DNA Databank Malaysia, the taking of DNA samples, forensic DNA analysis, the use of DNA profiles and information in relation thereto, and for matters connected therewith

## ONE-STOP FORENSIC IDENTIFICATION CENTRE

- Police had set up One-Stop Forensic Identification Centre at all district police headquarters nationwide
- Trained police officer placed at One-Stop Forensics Identification Centre to collect DNA samples





## Section 17– Removal of DNA profile and information from suspected persons index:

#### Not involved in the commission of any offence

#### Charge is withdrawn

**Discharged by court** 

#### Acquitted by court

Not charged in court within 1 year from of sample taken

### SECTION 13 - TAKING OF NON-INTIMATE SAMPLE


- Shall have the authorisation from "Authorised Officers" which are Police officers rank Deputy Superintendent Police and above
- Sampling taken from:
  - a) Somebody that is suspected to commit offences
  - b) Detainee
  - c) Drug dependants
- Shall be taken by gazetted medical officers or police officers or chemists


Chemistry Department of Malaysia – handling evidence samples

Royal Malaysia Police DNA Lab – handling databank samples




### MECHANISM

#### TOTAL NO. OF PROFILES IN FDDM AND NO. OF DNA MATCHING




 Approximately the crime scene DNA profiles from year 2013 -2018 is 85,000 **DNA** profiles which need to be upload into the database


 Capability to analyse approximately 50,000 samples per year




BSD 600 Punching System (1 unit)

## **SUCCESS RATE**

- Identifiler<sup>™</sup> Direct kit: ~ 92% (first run)
  ~ 92% (after re-amplify)
- Globalfiler™ Express kit: ~ 90% (first run)

~ 90% (after re-amplify)

• Most of the samples analysed with Globalfiler Express kit actually collected at 2013 - 2014
