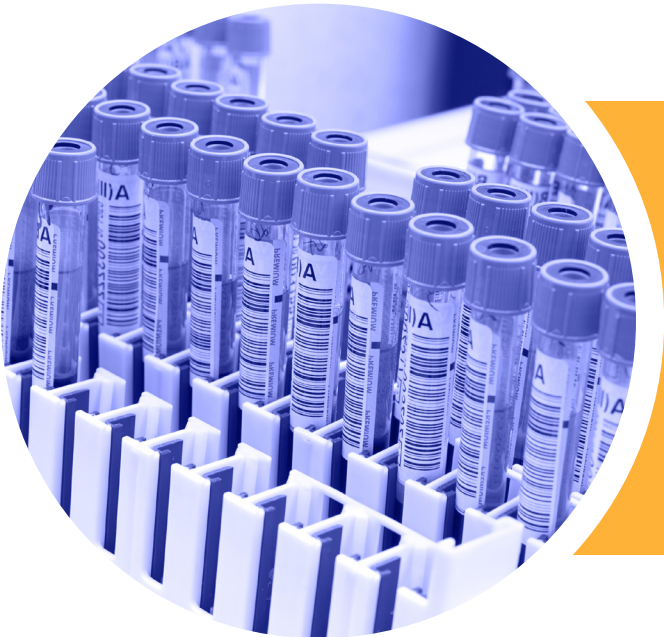


What makes your facility a biobank?
